



# **TSU launches IPIMS**



The institutional performance of Tarlac State University will now be easily monitored and updated through the Institutional Performance Information Management System (IPIMS) by 3rd quarter of this year.

IPIMS is a web-based system that collates and keeps track of targets of different colleges and offices within the university allowing the Office of Planning, Performance Monitoring, and Evaluation Office (OPPME) to access and review these reports by simply navigating the system online.

This paperless process will improve TSU's recordkeeping and documentation, as well as enhance the ability to identify and track areas of concern allowing the administration to react in a timely manner and develop needed interventions for unmet targets.

According to OPPME director for a public funded institution like TSU to be able to monitor its defined targets as mandated by law and its governing bodies such as the General Appropriations Act (GAA), Performance Based Bonus (PBB), and SUC (State Universities and Colleges) Levelling.

"Integration of processes is key to ensuring efficiency in the delivery of service," he said in an online interview.

This project has been the first of his priorities since becoming the director of the Institutional Performance Monitoring and Evaluation Office (IPMEO) in April 2019. This development is in partnership with the Management Information Systems Office (MISO) spearheaded by Dr. Heidilyn V. Gamido and Engr. Marlon V. Gamido with Mr. Mark Anthony L. Perez as the main developer.

"The IPIMS is a centralized repository of performance information of different offices and units of TSU. Currently, we are at Phase 1. After the initial tests and implementation, the system will evolve to its 2nd and 3rd phases wherein 'Planning and Monitoring' and 'Risk Management' will be integrated respectively," said

Tarlac State University held its first ever online commencement exercises on June 29-30, 2020 via Facebook Live through the official page of the Office of Public Affairs (OPA) sending off a total of 1,105 graduating students.

The production, spearheaded by OPA director Ms.

Jazzel Llaneli M. Manabat, is in compliance with Section A.1.f of the Commission on Higher Education's (CHED) COVID Advisory No. 7 which prohibits higher education institutions (HEIs) from conducting mass gatherings including graduation ceremonies.

The online graduation followed the traditional program of the annual exercises where University President Dr. Myrna Q. Mallari virtually conferred the degrees of 509 graduates on the first day and 596 graduates on the second

In place of the distribution of diplomas, college deans and respective department chairs announced the names of the graduates one by one which are then flashed on screen.

Meanwhile, Tarlac 2nd district representative Hon. Victor A. Yap also sent a video of his commencement speech from the House of Representatives.



## TSU strengthens services through online platforms



Tarlac State University has already prepared for its online services years ago sans pandemic threats. Efficient service, through software and web-based systems, is one of the university's targets to better serve its clients.

Among the online services of TSU which shined during the "new normal" scenario are the TSU College Admission Test (TSU CAT) online application and release of results, Microsoft Teams, and the student portal.

#### First TŜU CAT online application

Launched in December 2019, the first online application for the undergraduate students' admission test has become a leap towards making work easier for TSU as it serves as the first of the many online transactions for students

Aside from the online application, test results were also released online with an embedded data privacy notice. Unlike last year's release of results, applicants need not bear with the long queue to check if they are qualified to enroll

Both application and release of results are accessed via the TSU CAT website. https://cat.tsu.edu.ph/.

Steps and procedures of the online application, as well as the documentary requirements, are also posted on the website to properly guide the applicants. Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) are also featured to give basic information including the things they need to bring during the admission test

The confirmation of slots for enrollment is also incorporated in the same website 2016 which makes the transactions easier

where the incoming freshmen can express their intention to pursue their studies in **TSU** 

#### MS Teams' Way

As early as 2017, the university availed of the Microsoft Office 365 subscription which includes Microsoft Teams – the online platform which serves as the university's learning management system (LMS).

The Management Information Systems Office (MISO) has facilitated several Microsoft Teams seminars and trainings to prepare the teaching workforce for flexible learning.

According to Mark Anthony Perez, MISO computer programmer and Microsoft Teams trainer, the university has been targeting to educate the faculty members on how to use the MS Teams even before the lockdown was imposed in Luzon.

#### Student Portal

With the implementation of flexible learning, the student portal will play a great role in the distance education of the TSUians as this will be their means to view their schedule, log in to Microsoft Teams, and to check their grades.

Aside from Teams, the online payment is also linked to the student portal. Payments of fees, such as the tuition of graduate school students, can be done via the Internet Payment Gateway. Once the payment has been done, a notification will be sent to the TSU system for proper recording and validation.

'Familiarization of tools to be used for flexible learning is a requisite to both students and faculty members to avoid disturbances in the delivery of teaching and learning. This can be done by frequent use of identified tools. Student portal records are derived from the university system; hence students should regularly visit respective portals to monitor grades, and academic records," College of Computer Studies dean Engr. Marlon Gamido said in an interview.

Students are also advised to use strong passwords and, most importantly, must not forget them.

Meanwhile, those who seek tutorials are also advised to check and visit Microsoft Educational Center where they can also have a certificate upon the completion of their tutorials.

#### TSU Scholarship Online Application

The MISO is also developing a system where students can apply for scholarship programs online. This web application will automate the manual process of the scholarship application. A total of 20 scholarship providers are listed in the system where students can freely choose the scholarship they want to avail.

"Students who need financial assistance may apply by just filling [out] the forms and should upload necessary requirements in the system. Approval of the application will be managed by the Scholarship Unit. Applicants will get a notification whether The university partnered with the they are qualified or not," Perez said in a phone interview.
