


ABOUT THE COVER



The anniversary marks the acquisition of the 10-hectare lot in Barangays Ungot and Maliwalo by former president Prof.


Jack P. Smith through the donation of the couple Serafin and Lucinda David on the same day in 1973.

David road signage at the Lucinda Campus and the ceremonial signing of the deed of donation and acceptance of the 2,592 square meters of land where the university's male and female dormitory will soon rise.





FINANCIAL POSITION



When it comes to the financial aspect of the university, accounting of funds is robust with checks and balances installed to safeguard all funds.

As of December 31, 2023, the total consolidated Assets, Liabilities and Government Equity of the university amounted to Php 1.932 billion, Php 146 million, and Php 1.786 billion respectively.

93.74% of the total appropriated budget of the university was released and is valid for obligation, while part of the unreleased appropriations is under Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses, particularly for the locally funded projects, Futures Thinking and Strategic Foresight, and the Tulong Dunong Program. Both projects were requested before the end of the year, but the release was held in abeyance while waiting for the issuance of the guidelines for the release and utilization of funds under continuing appropriations.

Unreleased appropriations under Capital Outlay are related to the locally funded project "Increase in Carrying Capacity of Nursing and Allied Health Programs," which was also already requested before the end of the year. The release was also held in abeyance while waiting for the issuance of guidelines. In addition, the said project has been forwarded to the Head of the Procuring Entity for notice of approval.

For the obligations rate, the university logged an average of 93.49% for all allotment classes, still within the financial plan and the submitted budget execution documents. Disbursements rate, on the other hand, logged a notable 98.63%, averaging that of the Personnel Services, Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses, and Capital Outlay.

Major considerations under this result concern Lot 2 of the locally funded project "Additional Advanced Manufacturing Equipment for Industrial and Electronics Engineering of the College of Engineering and Technology" with an approved budget of P10,000,000.00 (awaiting "Notice to Proceed" issuance) and the "Construction of 2-Storey, 6-Classroom School Building, La Paz Campus" with an approved budget of P20,000,000.00 (to be undertaken by La Paz LGU).

Other than the Retirement and Life Insurance Premiums, remitted a month behind, the other unpaid obligations consist of the usual expenditures, obligated toward the end of the 4th quarter, neither cleared nor claimed before the quarter ended. Hence, these were reflected as unpaid obligations.

Of the total adjusted appropriations of the university, 93.65% was released while only P5,000,000 of the Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses, related to "Increase in Carrying Capacity of Nursing," remained unreleased.

The university was able to use 87.80% of its continuing allotments by recalibrating its current operations. The university found several opportunities for improvement where the funds can be put to good use.

For Capital Outlay, part of the unobligated allotment is related to the savings under the project "Infrastructure and Smart Campus Development, Operationalization of Face-to-Face Classes, and Upgrading/Procurement of Equipment." The said locally funded project was awarded to the winning bidder last November 28, 2023, whose bid amounts only to P15,603,961. The unpaid obligated items relate to the same project.

The university logged an average of 79.87% disbursement rate for all allotment classes.

FINANCIAL TARGETS AND ACTUAL ACCOMPLISHMENTS AS OF 4TH QUARTER OF FY 2023

The material amount of unobligated allotments from the regular agency fund in 2022, which formed part of the university's continuing appropriations, led to the 36.64% utilization rate of internally generated income. The university prioritized the use of GAA funds, particularly continuing appropriations, as part of its recalibration initiatives.

Another reason is the number and projected amounts of infrastructure projects the university endeavored to undertake for the following years. Most of these are priority projects previously proposed for GAA funding but were not approved. In effect, the university transferred these projects for funding through the university income, restricting the use of such funds that were earmarked for the said priority infrastructure projects.

Moreover, in compliance with CHED Memorandum Order No. 2, s. 2012, prescribing the policies and guidelines for the use of income, special trust fund, and programs of receipts and expenditures of state universities and colleges, the university is required to appropriate not less than 10% of its total internally generated income as mandatory reserves for any unexpected event that may adversely affect the institution and its operations.

In sum, TSU undertakes to improve on financial management to serve its stakeholders better, particularly on the implementation of infrastructure projects in accordance with the approved Land Use Development and Infrastructure Plan.







MEMORANDA OF AGREEMENT







Tarlac State University inked a partnership with Huawei Philippines on April 11, 2023 to develop practical skills for the information and communication technologies (ICT) industry through the Huawei ICT Academy.

Through this partnership, TSU is appointed as a Huawei Authorized Information Network Academy (HAINA), where the university is provided with free training materials and is empowered to offer Huawei certification courses to students through the HAINA platform.



The project G-iRIDE: Gerona Innovative Roving Interactive Instructional Materials for Diverse Educational Needs was sealed on August 9, 2023 through a quadripartite memorandum of agreement with ALS DepEd Tarlac Province, Department of Science and Technology-Tarlac, the local government of Gerona, and Tarlac State University at the Gerona Municipal Hall.

Through this collaboration, around 500 learners of the Alternative Learning System (ALS) in Gerona town are set to benefit from an old ambulance repurposed into a mobile school with a solar-powered television – the first mobile school in Central Luzon designed to serve ALS.



The Department of Health (DOH) and United States Agency International Development (USAID) RenewHealth partnered with Tarlac State University on July 18, 2023 to help the Persons Who Use Drugs (PWUDs), those in recovery, those whose families are struggling for informal care, and other recovery support to refrain from drug dependence.

The CPath is a safe way for refugees to be welcomed for a lawful stay in a third country and meet their international protection needs.

The MOA signing and capacity building among the three institutions/agencies will give opportunities to better the refugees' lives, such as studying as scholars, proper health care, and other essential services to live a "normal life" in an inclusive space within the university.

Other than ranking first, TSU was also awarded an exemplary passing performance after 100 percent of its takers passed the said board examination.



LIBRARY WANAGEMENT AND SERVICES LIBRARY USERS STATISTICS








TOTAL 80 RECOGNIZED ORGANIZATIONS





Several centers were also established in 2023 to boost the university's research and extension potential.































OFFICE OF UNIVERSITY RESEARCH DEVELOPMENT

The University Research Office (URO) was restructured by virtue of Board Resolution No. 14 series of 2020. In 2022, it was again restructured and renamed the Office of University Research Development (OURD). The primary function of the OURD is to generate, oversee, coordinate, consolidate, and operationalize the conduct of research activities along the priority areas of the university.

The University Research Agenda

To strengthen the specializations of TSU in its research endeavors, the university research agenda was compressed from a 10-point agenda into a five-point agenda, which was approved in December 2020 by BOR Resolution No. 88 series of 2020 and is still in effect until 2023. This will enable TSU to establish its core functions in creating a significant contribution to scientific research undertakings and impacting national development.



INTERNATIONAL RESEARCH COLLABORATION WITH TAIWAN



Pres. Arnold E. Velasco, OURD Director Dr. Robert V. Marcos, and Prof. Maria Sheila G. Medina visited the National Ping Tung University of Science and Technology on April 24, 2023 to secure an MOU. NPUST expressed the need for more meetings between TSU and NPUST officials, while Prof. Jyh Jian Chen wishes to visit TSU to collaborate with university scholars on academic projects.

The same delegates visited the National Taipei University on April 25, 2023. TSU will submit research proposals, specifically on governance, for potential collaborations of ongoing research, presentation, and possible financing by the Taiwanese government.

Interested organizations, institutions, and communities may use the catalog as a bridge in connecting with TSU by determining which specific extension programs and services they wish to request.









In his presentation during the closing meeting, he suggested several opportunities for improvement to strengthen and "deepen" the university's QMS, which started in 2015.


TSU President Dr. Arnold E. Velasco committed to complying with all the recommendations and suggestions that the auditor shared.


